# **RULES - Please read**

- 1. Exhibits must have been raised by the exhibitor in the exhibitor's own garden or allotment or on land belonging to another person that may be cultivated by an exhibitor exclusively for his own use.
- All exhibits must be staged by 10am. NO EXHIBIT MAY BE REMOVED UNTIL AFTER PRIZE GIVING
- 3. Each exhibitor to find a suitable receptacle for their exhibit. No responsibility accepted by the Committee for any loss.
- 4. In the event of a Judge giving an exhibitor two awards in one class, the highest award only will count for points award.
- 5. The decision of the Judge is final and they shall have the power to withhold any award where they consider an exhibit does not merit an award.
- 6. Protests must be made in writing and handed to the Committee no later than 3.30pm
- 7. No exhibitors or unauthorised persons will be allowed in the tent whilst judging is taking place.
- 8. Exhibitors and helpers only will be allowed in the tent before judging starts and the opening of the Show.
- 9. Points towards Trophies and similar awards: 1st 5 points, 2nd 3 points, 3rd 1 point.
- 10. Trophies to be engraved by winners.
- 11. Exhibitors infringing the rules will be disqualified, banned from future shows and forfeit their award.
- 12. All pot plants will be examined for disease and pests, the Stewards will remove any such entries.
- 13. All matters not provided for in these rules shall be left to the discretion of the Committee.
- 14. All Trophies to be returned to the Secretary on or before entry night (Wednesday before Show).
- 15. \*Novice Class is for any exhibitor not having won a first prize in the Horticultural Section in a previous Show.
